Dear Clark-Shawnee Families,

After careful consideration, the Clark-Shawnee Board of Education and Administration has made the decision to commit to hybrid learning for students in the in-person learning model for the first quarter of the 2020-2021 school year. The [hybrid model](#) operates with reduced capacity allowing for more social distancing in classrooms, lunchroom, hallways, and on school buses.

Families should plan for the first day of school for the 2020-2021 school year to be Tuesday, September 8 for students in online learning and in-person learning students with last names that begin with A-K. In-person learning students with last names beginning with L-Z will begin on Thursday, Sept. 10. If your family has students with last names in both groups, please contact the school your child attends for assistance with getting your students on the same schedule.

Students in the Last Names A-K group will attend on Mondays and Tuesdays and engage in distance learning Wednesday through Friday. Students in the Last Names L-Z group will attend on Thursdays and Fridays and will engage in distance learning Monday through Wednesday. These distance learning assignments will be flexible so that students can work on assignments at times that work with their family's schedule.

Families can still choose distance learning in lieu of hybrid learning. All families must complete the [Family Intent Form](#) on our website under [Reopening Clark-Shawnee Schools](#) to choose in-person or distance learning for their students. This form must be completed by 8:00 PM on Monday, August 10. Any student who does not have a completed form as of 8:00 PM on Monday, August 10, will be assigned to in-person learning.

On Tuesday, August 4, Governor Mike DeWine announced an order that masks will be required for K-12 students in Ohio schools. While the official order which has not been released contains important details about what this order means for our students, we wanted to make sure all parents are aware that their students will be required to wear a mask in kindergarten through 12th grade while at school. There are limited medical exemptions to this order. Our mask and face covering policies may be updated when the Governor's order is publicly shared.

We appreciate your continued support and patience as we work to make this school year safe and supportive of learning for our students and staff.
