Proposal Considerations

- Needs of Students
- Safety of Students & Staff
- Multiple Preferences
- Vaccination Timeline
- Vaccination Efficacy
 - Moderna--28 days between doses
 - 92% Effective 14 days after first dose
 - 94% Effective 14 days after second dose
 - Pfizer--21 days between doses
 - 52% Effective 12 days after first dose
 - 95% Effective 7 days after second dose

Clark-Shawnee Operational Timetable--Vaccine Week 2

- Goal of our Reopening Plan
 - To safely provide as much in-person instruction as possible.
 - Employ pragmatic safety protocols--"What we can, where we can."
- February 2021
 - Continue the hybrid model through Feb 19.
 - Adjust the instructional schedule during the week of Presidents' Day.
 - Group A: Tues-Wed; Group B: Thur-Fri; VLA- Tues-Fri; PreK: Tues-Fri
 - Feb 22-26--All in person learners attend school M,T,H,F.
 - Wednesday 2/24 would be used to review and adjust operations.
 - Monitor staff/student absence and transmission data.
- March 1, 2021
 - All in-person learners to attend M-F.
 - All Virtual Learning Academy students receive live instruction M-F.
 - Monitor staff/student absence and transmission data.

Clark-Shawnee Operational Timetable

- All Current/Future Operational Changes Guided By:
 - Vaccination program for K-12 school employees
 - Guidance from CCCHD, ODH, ODE, and/or Governor DeWine
 - District data including attendance rates and transmission data
 - Ability to safely staff and maintain district operations
- Contingency Plans
 - If the safe operation of school becomes an issue for one or more buildings, the priority would be to temporarily transition to hybrid learning in lieu of full remote.
 - Factors such as substitute availability and internal coverage availability will factor into contingency planning.
- Class of 2021 Graduation Ceremony
 - May 28, 2021 at 7 PM
 - Location: Shawnee High School Football Stadium

Clark-Shawnee Operational Timetable

- March 1, 2021 is the ideal date for a move to a less restrictive operational model.
 - Governor DeWine is targeting March 1st as a target date for schools to make a move to less restrictive operations.
 - Provides time for distribution of vaccines to school employees in Phase 1B per Ohio's county-by-county approach.
 - Moves us out of the peak cold/flu season.
- Eliminate the Ohio Public Health Advisory System [colored tier system] as a trigger for our operations.

Quarantine Guideline Updates from ODH

- 1/7/21--Release of updated guidelines that state students and staff may continue to attend school during a normal quarantine period related to exposure in a classroom setting or on required school transportation if:
 - Face masks covering nose and mouth were worn at all times.
 - Social distancing was maintained. Guidelines cite:
 - The CDC acceptable distancing as 6 feet.
 - The American Academy of Pediatrics--desks should be placed ideally 6 feet apart and at a minimum 3 feet apart.
 - School has documented policies on mask-wearing, social distancing, hand-washing, COVID-19 management of individuals exhibiting symptoms, and routine cleaning and disinfection protocols.
- When all in person learners return to school, Clark-Shawnee Local will implement the new quarantine protocols.

Benefits of Adjusting Operations

- Increased and more regular live instruction in our schools.
- Increased and regular access to school meals and mental health professionals.
- Establishing more normalized school operations to benefit students academically, socially, emotionally, and physically.

Challenges of Adjusting Operations

- Decreased social distancing based on the CDC Guidelines.
 - Vast majority of social distancing would meet the American Academy of Pediatrics recommendations of at least three feet.
- Staff coverage due to absence.
 - Short list of substitute teachers.
 - Inability to use aides internally.
- Ongoing support of students who are isolated, quarantined, or received support from in-person teachers.

Vaccination of School Employees

- Vaccination of school employees is a component of Phase 1B of Ohio's Vaccination Plan.
- "K-12 school staff will begin to receive the first shot of the Moderna or Pfizer COVID-19 vaccination on Feb. 1, 2021."
 - (ODE Vaccine Update Message January 19, 2021)
- The CCCHD is working with the Clark County ESC to develop the notification plan for K-12 staff who intend to receive the vaccination.
